



# TREASURERS REPORT

### Summary of Financial Statements:

The financial statements were reviewed by BDO and no qualifications were noted. The financial statements will be posted on-line and we would be happy to answer any questions. We would like to thank Dan Luymes and BDO for their work in preparing the financial statements.

### Statement of Operations:

Financially, we did better than we budgeted for. We expected based on our budget to have deficiency of revenue over expenditure of \$5,553.

We ended up with excess of revenue over expenditures of \$7,428. Therefore, we finished \$12,981 better than we budgeted for. The main reason for this was an increase in revenue from our Walk for Kids Sake fundraiser and we received more donations than we planned for. Overall revenue was \$74,634 higher than budgeted.

Expenses were higher than budget as well as coming out of Covid we were able to offer more programing than we budgeted. Overall expenses were \$61,653 higher than budgeted as we put the extra revenue to good use.

### Statement of Financial Position:

### Bank Balance:

As at December 31, 2020, we have \$135,762 in our bank. - \$40,000 of this is from the CEBA loan (of which \$30,000 needs to be repaid by December 31, 2023 so we must plan for this). This amount sits as a liability on the balance sheet.

We have a reserve goal of 6 months of operations (it costs us approx. \$16,500/month to operate or \$99,000 overall as our reserve goal). We are currently at that goal including setting funds aside to pay the CEBA loan.

### Why the Reserve?

This goal of 6 months of operations might sound excessive, but it is crucial to our mission. BBBS is a long-term mentoring program. We don't believe in quick fixes after something is broken. We believe in long term preventive mentoring to help our youth become the best they can be. As such, we need to operate in such a way that ensures were around for the long term. At BBBS, the future is just as important as today.

So again, thank you to everyone who donated and volunteered to our programs in the current year. The impact of which, will be felt for years to come.
